Medication Management

As part of our ongoing improvement of safety in the College, we have a new Medication Management procedure in place. A couple of key points:

- Student Services may have or will be in contact with you regarding the update of Asthma plans, ASCIA plans and/or medication forms for those who require these.
- Panadol will not be stored at the College or administered at any time for first aid. If there is a reason for your child or young person to have this administered, please contact Student Services for the required form.
- We would encourage all parents and guardians to inform Student Services and teachers if there are any changes to medications or if there are any significant changes to your child or young person's health.

DIGITAL CITIZENSHIP & CYBERSAFETY

This year the College is exploring different programs and activities to help assist our young people care for one another, be wise about their own online safety as well as how to be good citizens in a digital world.

There are two ways that the primary school is doing this. Firstly, the whole primary school are enrolled with the Inform and Empower Cyber Safe incursions and lessons. The primary teachers and F-2 classes are also involved in the "Co-Design Project" being run by the Alannah and Madeline Foundation, which is helping create age appropriate and engaging resources for teaching digital citizenship.

To hopefully assist you in having some conversations with your primary aged children, we are providing some age-appropriate conversation prompts around the use of digital technologies. In coming months, we are also hoping to provide some opportunities to learn more through parent webinars provided by Christian Education National.

Primary Carpark

Over the holidays, we have had our carpark lines re-painted. There are a couple of things that have changed, and we are hoping that the flow and safety will improve with these changes.

- 1. There is now a painted pedestrian crossing from Reception/Front Office across to the staff carpark. Please watch for people crossing here.
- 2. The waiting bays are no longer in existence near the staff carpark. Instead, the yellow line goes all the way around to the drop-off zone.
- 3. You may idle on the yellow line all the way around, but do not park here.
- 4. The white drop-off zone is the only place students can get in and out of the vehicles.
- 5. All primary students waiting for pick-up in the afternoon will wait on the grass outside of Reception/Front Office.
- 6. Please drive to the top of the drop-off zone, or as close to, to help the flow of the traffic to make it as quick and seamless as possible.
- 7. If you do need to park, then the main carpark is available for both primary and secondary parents to use.
- 8. Where possible, it is safer for students to enter and exit vehicles on the left-side.

Thank you to everyone for your assistance in this, and please feel free to provide feedback on this and any other issue of concern as this helps us to improve safety for everyone.

Separated parents must contact us directly to have their orders left at the office for collection.



What did your child learn about at school?

The internet is a global network that connects people around the world! We can use it to do things such as online gaming, talking to friends and learning new things!





We sometimes get uncomfortable feelings. Our bodies give us early warning signs if something is making us feel uncomfortable or unsafe.

We can always talk to a <u>trusted adult</u> if we notice our early warning signs.





Some conversation starters:

- What are some fun and awesome things you like to do on the internet?
- Have you ever felt any of your body's early warning signs? What did you do?
- Who are your 5 trusted adults? (These could be parents, carers, family, teachers etc.)
